San Joaquin Valley Veterans (SJVV) is a unique project of WestCare California, Inc. that serves Veterans in Fresno, Madera, Merced, Kings, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, and Tulare Counties and collaborates with the State of California and local Veterans Administration (VA) branches to close the gaps in services WestCare currently offers to transitioning Veterans. SJVV operates out of four offices located in Fresno, Hanford, Merced, and Stockton. Each office serves as a single, welcoming location where Veterans can meet with Veteran service representatives from a variety of agencies.

SJVV's services include but are not limited to case management, Veteran advocacy, clinical support for Veterans with PTSD and other conditions, housing assistance for them and their families, employment assistance, linkage to their VA benefits, and transitional living. The offices of SJVV also provide an easily accessible space for Veterans to meet with service representatives, search for jobs, and attend support groups. SJVV serves all Veterans including members of the U.S. Army Reserve and National Guard, those who received honorable discharges, and anyone who served a day or more in the armed forces. SJVV is a place where Veterans are honored and respected and are empowered to change their lives one simple step at a time.

Meet Michael THIS IS HIS STORY

Prior to entering our program, Veteran, Michael R., found himself in quite a dilemma. He had been living with severe physical disabilities rendering him wheelchair dependent. The home that he resided in eventually fell into ill-repair and was deemed unfit for habitation, so finding a new home became a priority. Over the course of three years, Michael actively worked with multiple programs to find housing and had no luck due to the circumstances at the time. It seemed hopeless, but one day he was referred to WestCare and although reluctant, he decided to take a chance at finding a new home with the assistance of SJVV. Despite this bold decision, it was only the beginning of an arduous road that he would face in regaining his stability and independence.

At the time that Michael entered the program, he was very low-income, had poor credit, and was physically dependent on a standard wheelchair. These three distinguishing barriers created some of the most difficult challenges when seeking housing in Kings and Tulare Counties. However, with the very little disability income that he received from the VA, he was able to receive emergency housing assistance (EHA) from SJVV and was referred to the HUD-VASH program to obtain a subsidized housing voucher. During his stay at a local motel in Hanford, we provided housing navigation services, and sought appropriate housing that met ADA-compliance and was close to public transportation to/from the Fresno VA. However, with the help of Michael's daughter, Julie, the team was determined

to find him a new home. With the increasing rental rates and lack of affordable housing available, SJVV was intent on overcoming these barriers and finding a suitable home for him.

After months of working with SJVV and a few setbacks, the team was able to identify a unit that met all of his needs, a senior living community subsidized by Kings County Housing Authority. But then, as all seemed to be moving smoothly, his wheelchair began to malfunction, leaving him immobile. So, SJVV and his daughter worked together to assist him with transportation and his other needs. However, this was a huge set-back on his journey to regained independence. So, our Health Care Navigator began work immediately, working tirelessly to navigate the VA Health Care System (VAHCS) and in a few short months, he received a brand new electronic wheelchair. Shortly afterwards, Michael was approved for an ADA-compliant one bedroom unit and was provided a new bed, general housing supplies, and groceries to assist him in creating a new home for himself.

SJVV is incredibly grateful to have had the opportunity of working with as kind and resilient of a Veteran as Michael. To be given the opportunity to empower him to grow and change, is at the very core of our mission. Michael feels overwhelming joy about the new life he has been given and feels that his successful journey of exiting homelessness is a prime example of the perseverance and willful determination of the SJVV team.


In turn, he is eternally grateful.
