10/30: WestCare California Shares Its Halloween Spirit!


Up and down California and on behalf of our many diverse services, the entire WestCare California, Inc. family really showed their Halloween spirit this year!

10/24: 2020 Fresno AIDS Walk - Virtual Edition





Health & Wellness Corner

"Epilepsy 101" by Mark Leanhart, Program Director, Belmont Admissions and Outpatient



"Over my years here with WestCare, I have worked with quite a few clients with epilepsy and though I was very

comfortable assisting them during their seizures, I knew little about the disorder itself. November is National Epilepsy Awareness month and I felt it was a great time to become more familiar. Epilepsy is a neurological disorder resulting from abnormal activities in the brain and is common with over three million cases annually in the United States. This abnormal activity could be resulting from an inherited genetic condition, trauma to the head, diseases or developmental disorders. More specifically, epilepsy could be caused by a tumor, stroke, an infection such as meningitis, an injury during birth or as result of another developmental disorder such as autism. Most of us are familiar with the symptoms of epilepsy, which include the jerking and twitching of arms and legs often accompanied by temporary confusion and a blank stare. Severity of episodes and symptoms vary a great deal between individuals due to the type of seizure disorder that a person has. Seizures may occur over several years or may be a lifelong condition. Seizures may be preceded by a feeling of euphoria and may produce psychological symptoms of fear and anxiety as well as loss of consciousness and awareness. Treatments include medications and if medications fail, then brain surgery may be an option. Self-care includes taking medications as prescribed and getting adequate rest. The most important thing in assisting someone that is experiencing a seizure is clearing the area around them from others and of objects that could harm them such as furniture. Do not restrain them to prevent the jerking as that could be harmful to them. Do prevent the jerking motion from causing head injury with a soft pillow between head and hard surface if one is available. Also, know when to call 911. Knowing proper first aid is always helpful."


